Application For Participation Forest Landowners, Forest Managers and Primary Producers The Sustainable Forestry Initiative® (SFI) Program

The Sustainable Forestry Initiative® (SFI) 2015-2019 Forest Management Standard and the 2015-2019 Fiber Sourcing Standard are composed of principles, objectives, and performance measures designed to broaden the practice of responsible forest management among all forest landowners and primary manufacturing organizations.

Eligibility Requirements for SFI Program Participants:

- Any organization or agency involved in forestland management or primary forest product manufacturing in the United States and Canada may be eligible to participate in the SFI program. This includes, but not limited to:
 - Forest Products Companies;
 - Non-industrial Forest Landowners;
 - Public Forest Land Management Agencies;
 - Colleges or Universities Lands;
 - Conservation or Community organization; or
 - Tribal Landowners.
- All applications must be signed by an authorized representative of the company, organization, agency, or landowner. The signature by the authorized representative commits the company, organization, agency, or landowner to abide by the requirements of the SFI program and SFI 2015-2019 Standards and Rules, including, but not limited to, annual reporting requirements, participation in state or provincial-level activities through local SFI Implementation Committees, and payment of an annual licensing fee.
- Secondary manufacturers of finished forest products, such as plywood, furniture, windows, magazines, printers or catalogs and merchants or distributors should contact an accredited certification body for SFI certification options.

The SFI Program will notify the applicant in writing whether or not their application is approved. If approved, the applicant will receive an SFI Licensing Agreement, an invoice for the first annual licensing fee, and other program information. All applicants must sign the licensing agreement which formally commits the applicant to compliance with guidelines for the use of the SFI program service-marks.
