Forests: the Multiple values


- More than economic values and carbon: a healthy environment for people, secured livelihoods and safety nets, and more
- Daily subsistence needs of 1.6 billion people – mainly those marginalized by the global economy
- Challenge remains to holistically capture all the crucial dimensions of forests





A 360-degree perspective

- Value other forest functions and most services – much more than timber & carbon
- Intimate connections among forest ecosystems: cross-sectoral interaction
- Institutional partnerships beyond the forestry sector are required to tackle challenges, incl. governments & ministries, private sector and civil society





Forest Finance (1)

- Landmark Resolution adopted October 2009
- Created 2 mechanisms:
 - (i) The Ad Hoc Expert Group provides guidance and strategic orientation
 - (ii) The Facilitative Process provides the data from the field
- Together they form the Strategic Workplan on Forest Finance





Forest Finance (2)

A Cross-sectoral Perspective

- The Facilitative Process addresses all sources of forest financing, both inside and outside of the forest sector

- Global Environmental Facility
- Additional Donors

The Forest Instrument:

- Highlights forest law enforcement and governance as a key cross-cutting issue for all future UNFF Sessions
- Encourages Member States to support SFM through forest Law enforcement and good governance



Implementing SFM through forest law enforcement & governance: Initiatives



Several Member States have begun implementing the Forest Instrument:

- European Union has signed several Voluntary Partnership Agreements (Cameroon, Liberia, Ghana)
- Lacey Act (United States)
